Welcome to the 24-Hour Odour/Odor Management Marathon (24h-MOM), a truly unique international event that will take place on November 12, 2025, organized by a global coalition of 12 leading organizations and coordinated by passionate individuals dedicated to advancing this field.

On this occasion, we are launching an innovative and collaborative initiative that goes beyond the conventional: a continuous 24-hour journey crossing time zones and borders from Australia and New Zealand, through Asia, Europe, South America, and North America. An event of this magnitude and scope has never been held before, with the clear purpose of raising awareness about the importance of odour/odor management and celebrating the tireless work of the fantastic people who make up this global community.

During this marathon, the local organizing entities in each geographic region will be responsible for coordinating and selecting presentations that represent the main challenges, achievements, and advances of their respective areas. This will ensure that the diverse realities and approaches in the enjoyment, mitigation, and control of odours have their place in the international dialogue.

The call for content is open until August 15, inviting researchers, professionals, and students to submit proposals for this unprecedented international experience. When submitting their contents, participants must indicate the organizing entity corresponding to the time zone of their presentation, thus facilitating effective and equitable management of contributions across all regions.

The topics to be covered have a wide scope, including perception, impact, and formation of odours or VOCs, dispersion modeling, control technologies, source characterization and mapping, data analysis, artificial intelligence, regulatory frameworks, community engagement, corrosion management, case studies, and more.

The goal of 24h-MOM is to bring together the international community of specialists, scientists, consultants, plant managers, industries, government bodies, and social actors to promote the exchange of knowledge and experiences in an open, collaborative, and dynamic forum. We aim to create a space where new ideas challenge traditional approaches and drive the development of innovative solutions for the current and future challenges of odour management.

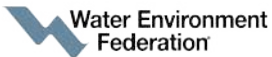
